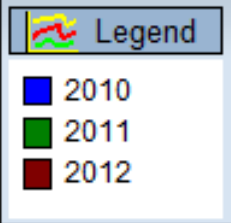

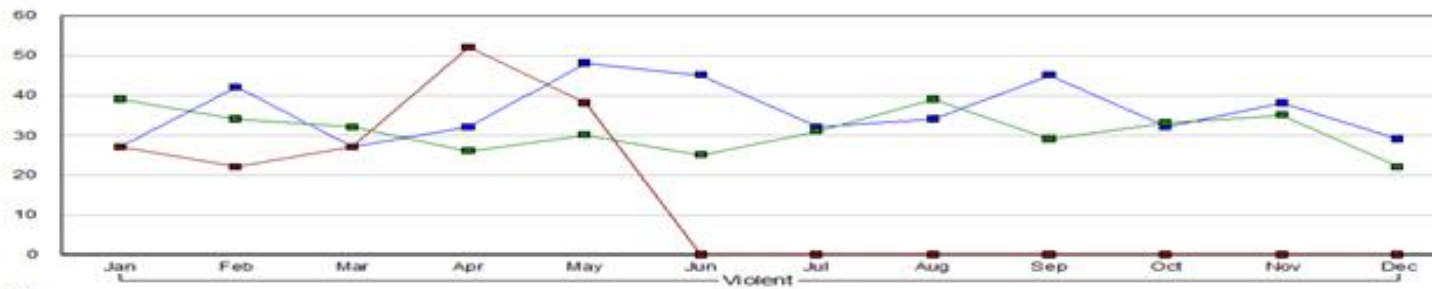
Part I Offenses 2010 - 2012

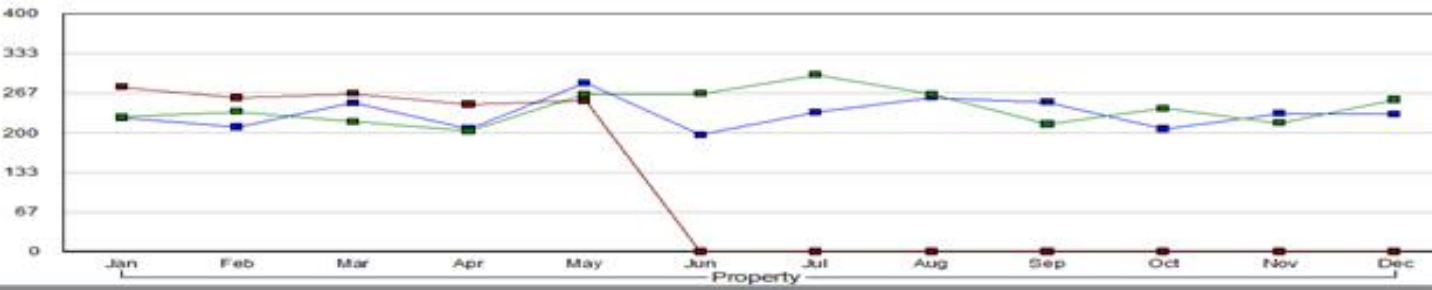

Property Crime

- ◆ 2012 Property Crimes Year-To-Date have increased:
 - 1145 in 2011 to 1299 in 2012
 - During May 2012:
 - Residential Burglary – 39 (high)
 - Burglary and Theft from Vehicle – 40 (average)
 - Commercial Burglary – 13 (low)
 - During first half of June 2012:
 - Residential Burglary – 11 (average but considerably lower than May)
 - Burglary and Theft from Vehicle – 10 (low)
 - Commercial Burglary – 5 (low)

Crimes Against Persons

◆ Cold Case

- The Major Investigations Team (MIT) is now into its sixth month of existence.
- MIT has developed a significantly stronger relationship with several law enforcement agencies at the State and Federal level, and with Mexico, resulting in a broader, yet more detailed, forensic analysis of evidence in several of the cold cases.

◆ Crimes Against Persons

- Corey Lyons was convicted and sentenced to life in prison for the 2009 Murders of Daniel Lyons and Barbara Scharton.
- Jack Mills was convicted and is awaiting sentencing for the 2010 Attempted Murder and Home Invasion Robbery on San Pascual Street.
- Robert Royal was convicted and sentenced to 11 years in prison for the 2011 Bank Robbery at the Bank of America on upper State Street.



27-Year Old Cold Case Homicide Solved

- ◆ Homicide Occurred on May 27, 1984 on the 500 block of Milpas.
- ◆ Argument outside of Las Conchas bar ends in a fatal stabbing.
- ◆ Murder suspect (Godoy) flees to Mexico after stabbing victim (Pineda) in the heart.
- ◆ SBPD places warrant in the system and involves the Mexican government authorities in the search for Godoy.
- ◆ Godoy moves around and is able to hide from us for 27 years.
- ◆ Over the years, several SBPD Detectives (some now long retired) continued the hunt along with Mexican authorities.
- ◆ With great follow-up work by Sgt. Duarte and Detective Crystal Bedolla, and in partnership with Mexican authorities, Godoy is arrested for murder on October 10, 2011 in Mexico.
- ◆ Recently, a Mexican Judge sentenced Godoy to 4 years in a Mexican prison. PGR and other Mexican law enforcement authorities are appealing the case, asking the judge to increase the time in prison.
- ◆ Godoy claimed self- defense, thus the Judge's decision of a 4 year sentence. Mexican prosecutors believe the judge has erred and are appealing the sentence length as too minimal for the crime committed.
- ◆ SPECIAL NOTE: Sgt. Duarte and Detective Bedolla were tasked with finding witnesses from the 1984 incident, and they did, some of whom were in different locations in the US and Mexico. Great work!



Youth Programs / PAL

- ◆ Cops and Kids Camp at Ocean Mesa Campground, El Capitan Beach
 - June 11-14, 2012; 5 days and 4 nights
 - Camp for 8th thru 12th grade students with the purpose of mentoring youth in the community and outlining what it means to be civically responsible.
- ◆ Campership Alliance
 - Goal – Provide youth with opportunities that engage them in positive activities
 - Camps start June 18th and run the entire summer.
 - The PAL Junior High School Sports League
 - 700+ 7th and 8th grade students from 4 junior high schools
 - Of students served, 84% are at or below the poverty level



Law Enforcement Classes

- ◆ Law Enforcement Classes for Junior High School and High School Students
 - Based on LAPD / LAUSD Model
 - Meetings with Superintendent and High School Principal
 - Visited Reseda High School and Mulholland Junior High School
 - Prepare for a career in law enforcement
 - Visit in the Fall with Dr. Cash and Junior High School and High School Principals
 - In the future, possible pilot with 1 or 2 classes at the High School
