

Total Violent Crime by Month 2009-2014



# **Downtown Directed Patrol**

## **March 10<sup>th</sup> – April 6<sup>th</sup>**

- ◆ **596 Misdemeanor Citations**
- ◆ **47 Misdemeanor Arrests**
- ◆ **18 Felony Arrests**
- ◆ **Highlights:**
  - **Increased officer presence focusing on the 600 block of State Street**
  - **Community Service Liaisons made daily contact with business owners & managers**
  - **Beat Coordinators conducted daily foot patrol in the Downtown corridor**
  - **Chief Sanchez & Sergeant Holtke met with many business owners & managers**
  - **Tactical Patrol Force patrolled area encampments**
  - **Criminal Impact Team continued aggressive enforcement during evening hours**
  - **Narcotics detectives conducted a directed patrol on April 3<sup>rd</sup> for drug violations**



# Restorative Court

## April 2013 – April 2014

- ◆ 131 Clients Processed Through Restorative Court
- ◆ 16 Were on the Common Ground Vulnerability Index
- ◆ 48 Graduated the Program after 6 Months of No New Arrests or Citations
- ◆ 37 Mental Health Assessments
- ◆ 17 Housed
- ◆ 70 Program / Shelter Placements
- ◆ 29 Referrals out of Restorative Court (Dept. 8, Mental Health Court, Prop. 36)
- ◆ 3 Referrals for Conservatorship Assessment
- ◆ 12 Relocations / Reunifications with Family
- ◆ 8 Clients Assisted with Filing for SSI Benefits
- ◆ 3 Deceased

# Elementary School Partnership

## ◆ A Collaboration Between SBPD's Beat Coordinators, the Community Action Commission & our Elementary Schools

- To discourage participation of elementary age youth in bullying and delinquency, and to confer with parents & teachers regarding early signs of unacceptable behavior
- Schools recently visited: The Santa Barbara Community Academy, Notre Dame, Monte Vista, Adams, Cleveland, Franklin, Washington, Monroe, and Harding



# Citizens Academy



- ◆ **Four 8-Week Citizens Academies Held So Far This Year**
  - 98 students attended
  - 2 Spanish language sessions at La Cumbre Junior High (night) & Cleveland Elementary (day)
  - 1 Bilingual session at The Santa Barbara Community Academy (day)
  - 1 English language session at Adams Elementary (night)
  - Next session will begin in September, will likely be bilingual and at Harding Elementary

# Explorer Post

- ◆ **25 Police Explorers** (13 Female, 12 Male)
  - Volunteered 500 hours of service this year
  - Explorer Ivan Govea received a \$1000 college scholarship from the Kiwanis Club of Santa Barbara
  - Took 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the Bearcat Pull at the LASD North County Competition
  - Will be competing in the Central Valley Explorer Challenge in July

# Police Activities League

- ◆ 11th Annual Putting Kids First Event was held April 25th
- ◆ Registration Underway for the Campership Alliance
  - 400 scholarships available for a variety of 1-3 week summer camps for children ages 3-18
- ◆ Cops 'n Kids Leadership Camp at Camp Whittier
  - June 7<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> for high school students, local leaders are being asked to speak
- ◆ Teen Center Summer Leadership Academy
  - To expand the Youth Leadership Council and provide opportunities for youth to complete community service hours with PAL

# G.R.E.A.T. Program

- ◆ **Gang Resistance Education and Training**
  - Gang and violence prevention program built around school-based, law enforcement officer-instructed classroom curricula
  - The goal is to help students practice developing positive solutions and appropriate decision making when faced with tough decisions
  - Can be used in conjunction with/to reinforce other prevention programs
- ◆ **Elementary School Curriculum for 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Students**
  - Immediately before the prime ages for introduction into gangs and delinquent behavior
  - Officers must be certified to teach the GREAT Program
- ◆ **Curriculum Consists of Six 30-45 Minute Lessons**
  - Parent/student interaction encouraged
  - Bullying behaviors addressed
