




Total Violent Crime Yearly Total

Total Violent Crime by Month 2009-2014








Total Property Crime Yearly Total

Total Property Crime by Month 2009-2014







## A One-Year Pilot Project


- ◆ **Gang Resistance Education and Training**
  - Gang and violence prevention program built around school-based, law enforcement officer-instructed classroom curricula
  - The goal is to help students practice developing positive solutions and appropriate decision making when faced with tough decisions
  - Can be used in conjunction with/to reinforce other prevention programs
- ◆ **Officer Adrian Gutierrez is Certified to Teach the GREAT Program**
  - Beginning the Week of October 6<sup>th</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Students
  - At Franklin, Cleveland, McKinley, Harding, Monroe, and Adams Schools & the Santa Barbara Community Academy
