SUBJECT: Records Destruction For Community Development Department

RECOMMENDATION:

That Council adopt, by reading of title only, A Resolution of the Council of the City of Santa Barbara Relating to the Destruction of Records Held by the Community Development Department in the Administration, Housing and Human Services and Building and Safety Divisions.

DISCUSSION:

The City Council adopted Resolution No. 16-005 on February 9, 2016, approving the City of Santa Barbara Records Management Policies and Procedures Manual. The Manual contains the records retention and disposition schedules for all City departments. The schedules are a comprehensive listing of records created or maintained by the City, the length of time each record should be retained, and the legal retention authority. If no legal retention authority is cited, the retention period is based on standard records management practice.

Pursuant to the Manual, the Community Development Director submitted a request for records destruction to the City Clerk Services Manager to obtain written consent from the City Attorney. The City Clerk Services Manager agreed that the list of records proposed for destruction conformed to the retention and disposition schedules. The City Attorney has consented in writing to the destruction of the proposed records.

The Community Development Director requests that the City Council approve the destruction of the Community Development Department records in the Administration, Housing and Human Services and Building and Safety Divisions listed on Exhibit A of the proposed Resolution, without retaining a copy.

SUSTAINABILITY IMPACT:

Under the City's sustainability program, one of the City's goals is to increase recycling efforts and divert waste from landfills. The Citywide Records Management Program directs that records approved for destruction be recycled, thus reducing paper waste.
