






Commercial Burglaries







February 2013 Commercial Burglary

Nightlife Enforcement Team

Mission

- Ensure public safety on weekend nights in the Downtown corridor through enforcement, education, and intervention with Downtown bar and restaurant owners and the citizens of Santa Barbara

Activity from June 2012 to February 2013

- Average of 12 premises checks / enforcement contacts per shift
- 59 alcohol related incidents involving minors
- 43 citations for entry utilizing false identifications
- 10 referrals of violations to ABC
- 4 Responsible Beverage Service trainings conducted




School Safety

- ◆ **Recommended the concept of Run / Hide / Fight**
- ◆ **February SWAT & CNRT training was held on the SBCC campus**
- ◆ **Once school admin. reviews / revises their policies the BC's and SRO will assist in presenting information to faculty and staff**


